Workshop Objectives

Skills: DVC teachers will be able to draw upon a range of resources and strategies to support learners to better engage in individual project work which includes divergent and convergent thinking.

Knowledge: Once the workshop is complete, teachers should know and understand that it is important to allow students to have time to explore and experiment with ideas (divergence), and that students need to feel safe / comfortable to incorporate their own interests and culture into the learning context.

Attitudes: Teachers should be more confident to support a range of learners in their diverse project work while also remaining open minded and flexible to a range of potential contexts for project work. Teachers should be able to see the benefit to all learners when diverse contexts and previously untried ideas are attempted in their classrooms.
