Whakawhanaungatanga

Whakawhanaungatanga encapsulates the concepts of building and maintaining relationships. It is a term that encompasses the values, attitudes, and practices that underpin social interaction.

Whakawhanaungatanga is a way of building tuakana-teina mentoring relationships where the tuakana (experienced person) provides guidance, support, and advice to the teina (less experienced person), helping them to develop their skills, knowledge, and confidence. In return, the teina shows respect and gratitude to the tuakana, and strives to learn and grow from their mentorship.


